At Olympia Mill Village Museum our free educational programs actively engage K-12 students with our shared history. Olympia Mill Village's past provides a case study for turn-of-the-twentieth century national history with opportunities for celebration as well as understanding difficult legacies.

Programs

Each program supports the SC Social Studies Standards (2020) and is accompanied by pre- and post-visit lesson plans, activities, and primary sources that can be adapted to different grade levels.

To Work or Study?: Comparing Children in the Past with the Present (K-2) educates students about the lives of mill children in the early twentieth century, including how they studied, worked, and played. This program focuses on how childhood today is similar to, yet different from, the past.
